Interconnected Electricity Systems and Networks – What does the future look like?

The Topic

Rapid changes in technology and the increasing engagement of consumers investing in electricity generation and home storage is something we're all thinking about. This and other developments will result in shifts to the current distribution model which is largely centralised through existing transmission and distribution networks. The growth in behind the meter generation also has major potential implications for the future of new distributed and grid connected generation assets.

The Think Tank will consider:

- The technologies that increase customer control and independence.
- How in future, electricity is sourced by consumers whether from household / business generation, community initiatives, distributed or grid connected generation.
- The impacts of electric vehicles and other home battery storage solutions.
- The speed of change.
- The changes required to commercial systems and market structures to support the future.
- The risk of significant value loss from existing centralised distribution, transmission and generation assets becoming stranded.

The Approach

Bill Heaps (Strata Energy Consulting) will again facilitate the Think Tank.

The following hand-picked speakers will cover the areas of customer dynamics, infrastructure, commercial systems and markets and legal and regulatory to ensure a balanced perspective is provided of what the future looks like and what changes will be required:
