- Revision to Part 2
- Outcomes to be promoted
- Increased national direction
- Priorities and conflicts resolved
- Biophysical limits, outcomes and targets



## Te Ao Māori & role of Māori in the system

- Concept of Te Mana o te Taiao
- To give effect to principles of Te Tiriti.
- National directions how the principles would be given effect
- Who "iwi, hapu or whanau" and "Mana Whenua"
- National Māori Advisory Board
- Roles in decision making established
- Roles in monitoring and oversight

### Reducing complexity...

- Combined Plans
- Reduced consenting requirements
- Certainty on notification
- Removal of 'pursuant to Part 2' test
- Removal of 'status quo' bias
- Increased use of economic instruments
- Focus on technical assessment
